The Journal of Virtual Reality and Broadcasting has re-launched its website. The new site offers a fresh look, new functions and is add-free.

Most new functions are centered on the articles: Every article is now equipped with linked keywords and author names. The download of articles' metadata is available in several exchange formats like Endnote, Bibtex, RIS or Wordbib. Furthermore, a list of authors and their publications in JVRB are linked in the top navigation bar.

The event calendar and the news stream are available as RSS feed. Every event presented in the calendar provides a vCal- or iCal-download for a direct import to your calendar.






Submissions

JVRB received 8 submissions in 2012, of which 2 have been accepted and 1 rejected. No article has been recommended for a resubmission after major revision. Currently, 18 articles are still under review, no articles have been withdrawn.

The article with the longest processing time has been under review for 739 days and needed 29 review enquiries before three appropriate referees were found. The fastest review process took 298 days and required 17 enquiries.

Reviewers

Currently, 326 international experts with a broad range of research interests from 33 different countries are voluntarily reviewing submissions for JVRB and help to guarantee a high quality standard for the Journal's publications.

The main focus of expertise is on Media Technology, Computer Graphics and Human Factors. The field of Interactive Broadcasting is still not sufficiently covered. JVRB has conducted 41 reviews in 2012 with a term of 21 days per review. 219 review enquiries were made. Only 18,7% of all review enquiries were successful (compared to last years 21%).

Last year, 35 reviews were submitted in time or earlier. Again, the fastest review took one day. The most protracted review was finished after 86 days. Only 14% of all reviews were submitted overdue.

Approximately 21 enquiries per article were necessary to find the reviewers. The number increased more than double compared to 2011 (8 enquiries) and had strong influence on the processing time. The average processing time was 458 days (from submission to notification).
