



News

JVRB is now on twitter

JVRB has joined the social network Twitter (www.twitter.com) with a microblog for the Journal's events, article releases and news.

Thereby, the Journal invites researchers, authors, and developers from the field of Virtual Reality, Broadcasting and related fields to join, comment on and discuss the publication. Twitter offers a public, real-time medium for fast exchange and dissemination of information. The user can now participate not only via an internet browser but also by phone or from the computer desktop.

JVRB-members signed petition

On October 20th, 2009 a petition was filed in the German Bundestag to grant citizens free access to academic research results that have been publicly funded. JVRB encouraged its members to sign the e-petition to emphasize the importance of discussions and exchange of ideas in research.

About 23.600 citizens signed until the enquiry was closed on December 22nd, 2009, which is only about half the required number of undersigned to commit the German Bundestag to discuss this issue.






Submissions

JVRB received 33 submissions in 2009, of which 9 have been accepted and 2 rejected. 1 article has been recommended for a resubmission after major revision. Currently, 21 articles are still under review, no articles have been withdrawn.

The article with the longest processing time has been under review for 379 days and needed 15 review enquiries before three appropriate referees were found. The fastest review process took 40 days and required 7 enquiries.

Reviewers

Currently, 269 international experts with a broad range of research interests from 34 different countries are voluntarily reviewing submissions for JVRB and help to guarantee a high quality standard for the Journal's publications.

The main focus of expertise is on Media Technology, Computer Graphics and Augmented Reality. The field of Interactive Broadcasting is still not sufficiently covered. The number of experts in the field of Virtual Environments has increased since 2008. JVRB has conducted 70 reviews in 2009 with a term of 21 days per review. 397 review enquiries were made. Only 18% of all review enquiries were successful (compared to last years 33%).

Last year, 41 reviews were submitted in time or earlier. Again, the fastest review took one day. The most protracted review was finished after 62 days. 41% of all reviews were submitted overdue.

Approximately 12 enquiries per article were necessary to find the reviewers. The number increased compared to 2008. The average processing time was 142 days.
